

## Code of Conduct

We are committed to providing a welcoming, harassment-free DigiCert Security Summit for everyone, regardless of gender, sexual orientation, disability, physical appearance, age, race, ethnicity, or religious beliefs. By participating in the DigiCert Security Summit, all attendees, speakers, sponsors, partners, and staff must abide by the following Code of Conduct. This Code of Conduct applies to all DigiCert Security Summit workshops, sessions, social events, and online activity, and outlines our expectations for participant behavior, as well as the consequences for unacceptable behavior.

**1. Respect others.** As mama always said, 'treat others the way you wish to be treated.' So collaborate, network and strategize! After all, the DigiCert Security Summit only comes once a year! Demeaning, discriminatory, intimidating, harassing or abusive or harassing behavior and speech will not be tolerated. Harassment may include but is not limited to: offensive verbal, written or electronic comments related to gender, sexual orientation, race, religion, disability; nudity and/or sexual images in public spaces (including presentation slides); deliberate intimidation, stalking, or following; harassing, photography, or recording; sustained disruption of sessions, talks, or other events; inappropriate physical contact, and sexual attention.

**2. Bring your true and authentic self.**

**Attendees are required to register with their true name and identity, without mimicking the likeness of anyone other than themselves. Login information must not be shared or used for attendees other than the original registrant.**
